## **EMI TRAINING ACADEMY SUMMER SCHOOL**

**Monday 13 September to Sunday 19 September 2010  
Brussels, Belgium**

### **Target group**

University/PhD students or recent graduates who have a strong interest in European affairs.

### **Objective**

To introduce the students to EU policies and to the different opportunities available to them.

### **Draft programme**

Tuesday 14 – Friday 17 September: seminars and evening dinner

Saturday 18 September: Evaluation of the training (interviews, questionnaire, photos), and free afternoon

### **Participation fee: 2 options**

If you pay the full fee of 750€, all your expenses are covered once you arrive in Brussels (lectures, accommodation, meals, local transport). This does not include travel expenses to and from Brussels.

You can also choose to pay a reduced fee of 300€, which would include lectures, meals and local transport. In this case you are free to find your own accommodation.



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### **Selection procedure**

The students are required to send a CV and a motivation letter in English. The following criteria will be used:

- Fluency in English – the training will be in English
- Good knowledge of the EU
- Motivation

The deadline for applications is 15 July. Participants will be confirmed by 23 July.

### **Sustainability and added value**

The European Movement International, with its growing network of 42 National Councils and 27 International member associations across Europe has direct access to professionals of the EU structure at all levels. Thanks to the EMI Training Academy, students have direct access to people who they would normally not meet.

This will be a yearly project so the partnerships established with external contacts should grow into long-term relationships.
